Updated numbers from Tom:

Institution	<b>Total Items</b>	00 Barcodes	Overlap w ND
Saint Mary's	241,869	202,148	161,186
Bethel College	118,090	65,954	53,084
Holy Cross College	16,979	12,349	9,336

So, each institution has a reasonable percentage of records which have 00 type barcodes but don't overlap with ND.

The next thing to do is to look at records between other institutions. I took a look at SMC and found that the following:

Overlap between SMC and BCI: 62,364

Overlap between SMC and BCI not accounted for in the ND/SMC overlap: 12,774

Overlap between SMC and HCC: 11,489

Overlap between SMC and HCC not accounted for in ND/SMC overlap or BCI/SMC overlap: 725

So, if we were only re-barcoding overlapping records instead of everything, we'd need to re-barcode:

161,816 + 12,774 + 725 = 174,685

items, which is about 86% of the total 00's. Probably worth doing the whole works.

Just for comparison and completeness:

Overlap between HCC and BCI: 8449

Overlap between HCC and BCI not accounted for by any other re-barcoding efforts: 62

So, again, with Holy Cross, just re-barcoding duplicates would hit

9336 + 725 + 62 = 10,123/12,349 = 82% of the 00 barcodes

and Bethel comes out with a whopping:

53084+12774+62 = 65920/65954 = 99.9% of the 00 barcodes which are overlapping with someone anyway.

So there we'd be way ahead by just re-barcoding everything.

Hope these numbers help to make our case. Let me know if you need more information.

- we showed Fr. McGarry? the OPAC; INCOLSA in process of establishing new institution code for Tantur; we can wait until spring or summer for moving the OPAC files to production
- there may be pressure to complete the project within the year; perhaps new temporary personnel hired for this purpose
- how do we want to handle the union catalog component of the MALC Directors?
- there was some discussion on relative merits of Aleph union catalog when we are 5 years away from end of life of product
- union catalog would not provide added features available in 'next generation' platforms
- people tend to look more broadly for information these days as opposed to locally; they want regional availability
