The Prague Spring lasted for a couple of months in 1968 with goals of governmental reform and increases in individual rights. Overall, the Prague Spring was fairly nonviolent. Similar to uprising, a spring still faces opposition. In the case of the Prague Spring, the Soviet Union effectively ended the movement.
