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PROPERTY

Property law is foundational to both America's legal system and its market-based economy. This course will introduce you to some of the basic principles and concepts of property law, from their common law origins to their current manifestations. We will examine ownership of land, objects, cultural artifacts, water, oil and gas, animals, and intangibles such as intellectual property. We will discuss the law's approach to the acquisition and relinquishment of property; the rights associated with the ownership of property; and government's authority to create, take, and regulate property. The course will be highly participatory and, in keeping with the goals of the first-year curriculum, will emphasize legal analysis generally in addition to mastery of the specific subject matter.

Course details:

- The required casebook is Smith, Larson, & Camacho, *PROPERTY: CASES AND MATERIALS* (Aspen, 5th ed., 2022). The page numbers listed on the reading schedule (see next page) refer to this casebook.
- I may also distribute supplemental readings or items of interest from time to time (e.g. relevant news stories; readings for guest speakers); please check your email regularly.
- I don't use Canvas. Instead, I maintain a bare-bones course website at sites.nd.edu/bruce-huber. The current course syllabus, slides, supplemental readings, and other documents will be posted there.
- At several points during the term, the sections of Property will convene jointly in the Courtroom for special presentations by guest speakers. Attendance is required and the material presented may appear on the exam in some form.

Grading:

- The bulk of your grade will be determined by your performance on a three-hour, closed-book final exam. Further details about the exam will be provided later in the term.
- Active participation during class discussion is vital to a successful class. For this reason, your final grade may be bumped up or down depending on the quality and, to a much lesser extent, quantity of your participation. I will consider not only your overall preparedness and your comments and questions in class, but also your punctuality and attendance.
