## Catholic Social Teaching Research → Potential Research Questions

- 1. Does implicit or explicit exposure to the principles of CST matter with respect to the development of outcomes?
- 2. What is the value added from Catholic higher education with respect to CST outcomes?
- 3. What are institutions doing to teach and to practice principles of CST?
- 4. What experiences—before, during and after college—predispose individuals to considering CST and practicing the principles?
- 5. What combinations of inputs (e.g., extracurricular, co-curricular, residence life) contribute to exposure to and practice of CST?
- 6. In what ways do individuals incorporate and act out the principles of CST in daily life? Are their developmental changes overtime in how people do so?
- 7. Are their differences by individuals' major/discipline/career path with respect to integrating the principles?
- 8. How lasting are outcomes across the lifespan and how do they interact with other life events?
- 9. What roles do encounters with peers and exemplars play in the development and implementation of CST principles? What is the role of human relations/interaction? Of practice?
- 10. What is the relationship between incorporation of the CST principles and moral imagination?
- 11. What role does gender play and what are the implications?
- 12. What might be the reaction of religious minorities and *nones* with respect to CST; do they find the principles accessible? Relevant?
- 13. How do individuals understand the CST with respect to global challenges and practices across borders?
- 14. In what ways are CST principles consistent with and different than non-Catholic conceptions of justice (e.g., Jewish, Islamic perceptions), and how can the principles be understood as a means for common understanding?
- 15. How important is it that people act from an explicit CST framework (much good has been done without specific knowledge of the principles)? Can we translate CST principles to make a contribution to secular contexts?

- 16. What are the impediments to teaching and learning CST?
- 17. What are the impediments to living out CST?
- 18. What is the relation between CST and liturgy?
- 19. What is the relation between CST and ones experience of injustice or justice?
- 20. What is the role of the media/internet in the lives of youth and adults in encountering and developing understanding of CST?
- 21. How is emerging adulthood a unique context for CST development? What are the implications of CST for processes of vocational development?
- 22. How may CST develop through and carry across non-traditional education?
- 23. What is the role of baptismal gifts and gifts of the Spirit in fostering CST principles?
