The 2021 Notre Dame Student Peace Conference Committee announces this year's conference, **Beyond the Surface: Moving the Needle on Global Peace**, sponsored by the Kroc Institute for International Peace Studies.

In recent months, we have witnessed a great awakening of hearts and minds across the globe in response to many of these issues. Students can propose innovative presentations or sessions of all types: research papers or posters; presentations on experiential learning; panel discussions; artwork, performance, or media projects; or other project formats. We welcome proposals that highlight practice as well as those based on research.

Strong proposals might engage with, but are not limited to, topics such as:

- Ethnic Conflict
- Media
- Policy Reform
